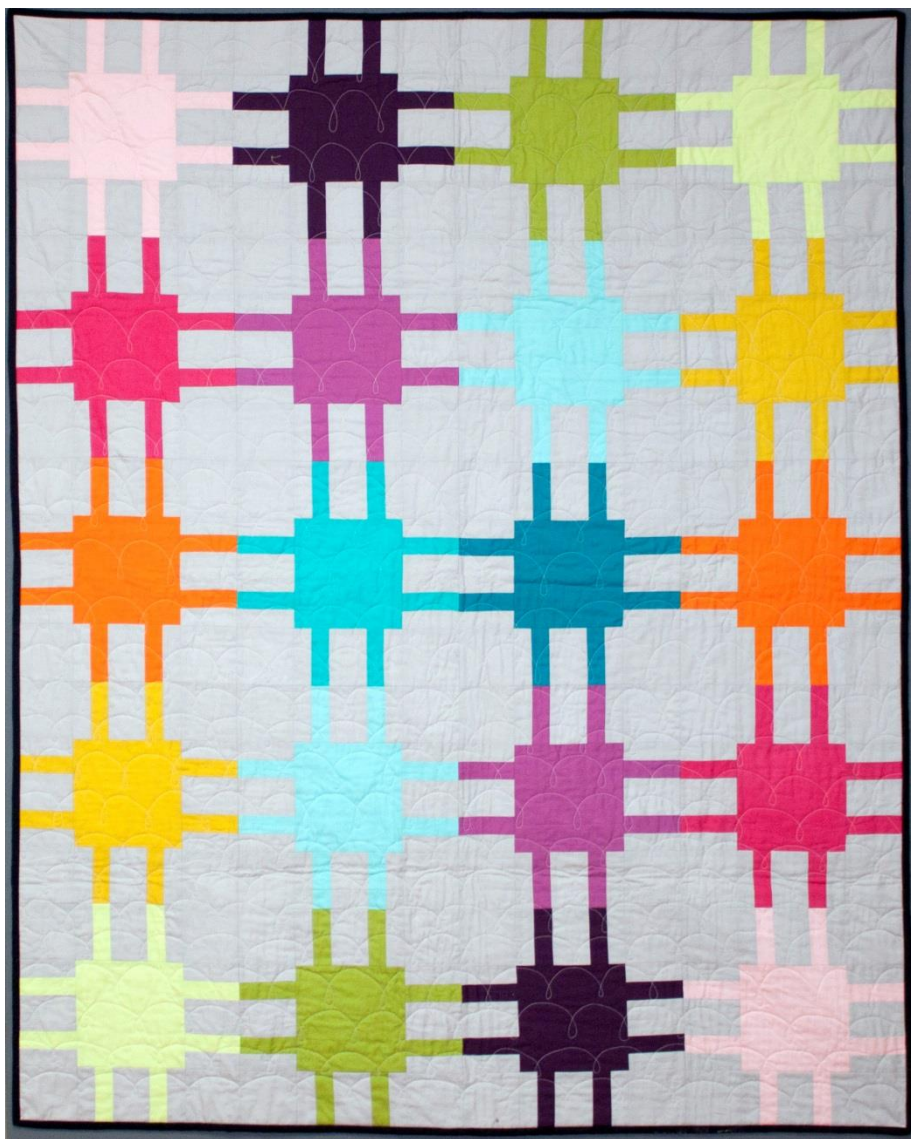


Mod Circuitry

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This simple patchwork pattern features beautiful solid fabrics, rich both in hue and in softness.

Skill level Beginner

Finished Dimensions 48 1/2" x 60 1/2"; unfinished block size, 12 1/2" x 12 1/2"

Fabric Requirements (based on 42"-wide fabric)

**Fabrics from the Art Gallery Fabrics Pure Elements collection; www.artgalleryfabrics.com.
Quilted with Aurifil 50 wt. thread.*

10 assorted solid fabrics—(1) fat quarter of each
Gray solid fabric ---2 5/8 yards

Backing 54" x 66"

Batting 54" x 66"

Binding 1/2 yard (based on 2 1/2"-wide strips)

Cutting Instructions:

Each Solid Fabric:

* (2) 6 1/2" squares

* (4) 1 1/2" x 15" strips

Gray Solid Fabric:

*(20) 1 1/2" x width of fabric (WOF) strips; subcut *each* strip into:

* (2) 1 1/2" x 15" strips

* (10) 2 1/2" x WOF strips; subcut *each* strip into:

* (2) 2 1/2" x 15" strips

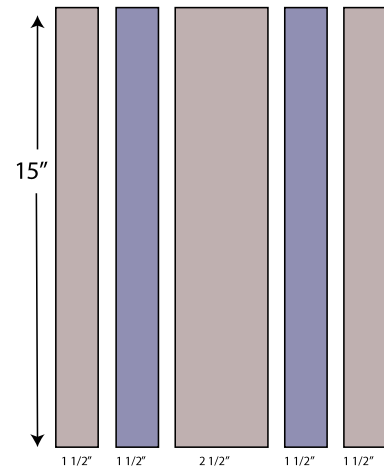
* (8) 3 1/2" x WOF strips; subcut *each* strip into:

* (11) 3 1/2" squares (8 squares will be left over)

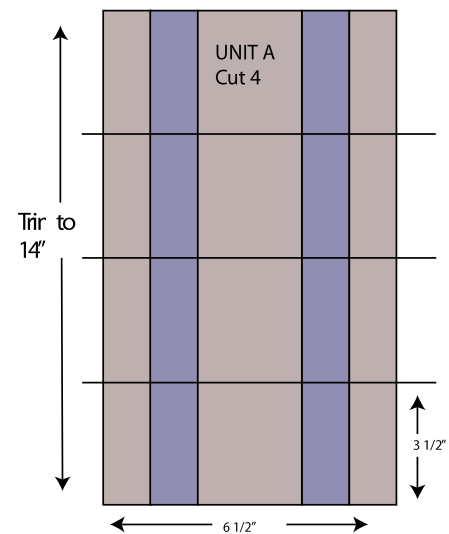
Make the Blocks

Note: Use a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance and sew with right sides together. Press seams open.

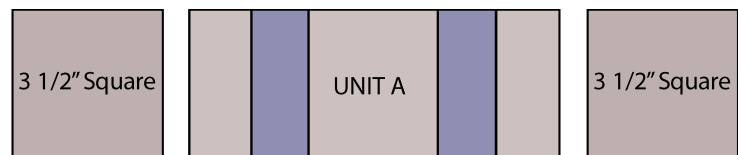
1. Sew matching $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 15" solid fabric strips to the long edges of a gray $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 15" strip. Sew a $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 15" gray strip to each solid fabric strip. The strip set should measure $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x 15"; trim the ends evenly to $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x 14".



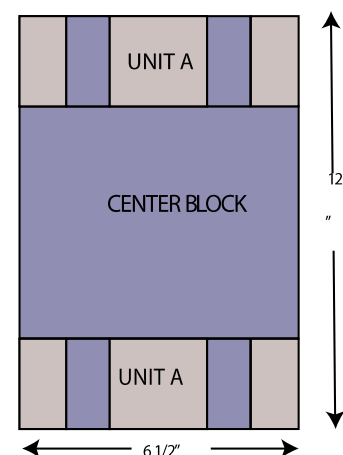
2. Subcut the strip set into (4) $3\frac{1}{2}$ "-wide Unit A segments.



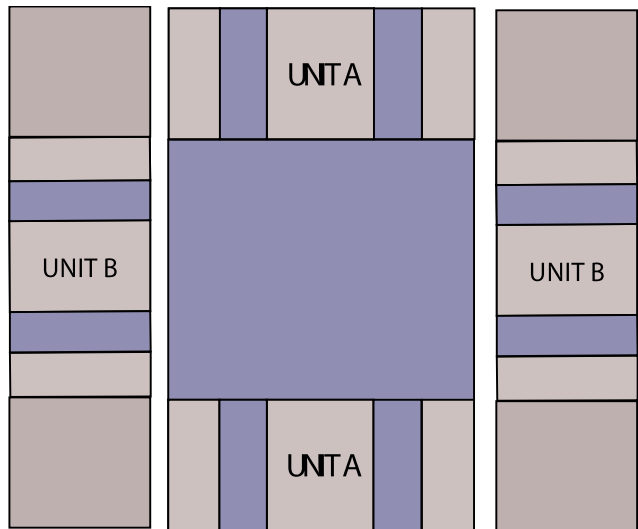
3. Sew a $3\frac{1}{2}$ " gray square to each end of **two** Unit A segments to make the Unit B segments. Each unit should measure $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $12\frac{1}{2}$ ".



4. Sew the two remaining Unit A segments to the top and bottom of a matching solid fabric $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " square to make a Center Unit. The unit should measure $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $12\frac{1}{2}$ ".



5. Sew a Unit B segment to each side edge of the Center Unit to complete the block. The block should measure 12 1/2" x 12 1/2"



6. Repeat steps 1—5 to make two blocks with each solid color for a total of 20 blocks.

Assemble the Quilt Top

7. Arrange the blocks in five rows of four blocks each.

8. Sew the blocks in each row together; press. Sew the rows together; press.

Finish the Quilt

9. Layer the backing, batting and quilt top. Baste the layers together.

10. Quilt as desired. A continuous line clamshell loop design in Aurifil 50 wt. thread was used for the featured quilt.

11. Bind the edges of the quilt.



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
