Large strips and quick-corner piecing with no matching seams mean instant quilt satisfaction. The machine quilting is by Angela Walters of Kansas City, Missouri.









ASSEMBLY

- Wash, starch and press fabrics. Cut the patches listed in the materials and cutting box and shown in the rotary cutting diagrams.
- 2 Referring to Fig. 1, layer a B on one end of an A with right sides together. Stitch across the B from corner to corner. Trim, leaving a ¼" seam allowance and press the B open to make a unit 1. Make 32 unit 1's. (You will have 4 leftover A's.)







QUILT ASSEMBLY & PARTIAL QUILTING PLACEMENT

Referring to the block piecing diagram, join two unit 1's to make a block. Make 16.

- 1 On a design wall or large, flat surface and referring to the quilt assembly diagram, arrange the blocks and sashing strips as shown. When you are satisfied with the arrangement, join the blocks and short sashing strips in rows. Join the rows alternately with the long sashing strips.
- 4 Mark quilting motifs as shown or as desired. Layer the backing, batting and quilt top. Baste. Quilt the marked motifs or quilt as desired. Bind the quilt to finish. Q

MATERIALS AND CUTTING

Requirements are based on 40" fabric width. Sashing strips are cut lengthwise.


BLOCK SIZE: 4" x 31" QUILT SIZE: 68" x 74"

CUTTING
from each fabric: 3 A
3 sashing strips 4½" x 68½", 18 sashing strips 4½" x 31½", 32 B
8 binding strips 2¼" X 40"
2 horizontal panels 72" x 40"
72″ x 78″

TECHNIQUES USED: quick-corner piecing, machine piecing, machine quilting

ROTARY CUTTING

Measurements include ¼" seam allowances. Align arrows with lengthwise or crosswise grain of fabric.
