Piecing Instructions


Block #1

- 1. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of (64) **Fabric A** 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares. (32 squares will be used for Block #1, 32 for Block #2)
- **2.** Place (1) **Fabric A** 3 ½" marked square, RST, on the corner of (1) **Fabric E** 3 ½" \times 6 ½", (1) **Fabric E** 3 ½" \times 9 ½", (1) **Fabric F** 3 ½" \times 9 ½" and (1) **Fabric F** 3 ½" \times 12 ½" rectangles.

Please note: **Fabric A** squares with the drawn diagonal lines will be oriented differently for each fabric rectangle. Refer to diagrams below.









- 3. Sew along the drawn diagonal line for each of the Fabric E and Fabric F rectangles as shown.
- **4.** Trim the seam allowance fabric to ¼", and press seams outward to complete the rectangle units for Block #1.









5. Repeat to create (8) completed rectangle units of each fabric and size as described in Steps 1-4. Diagrams show accurate fabric orientation and unfinished sizes for each rectangle.










6. Begin Block #1 center assembly using all rectangle units created in Steps 1-5, (1) **Fabric A** 3 ½" square, (1) **Fabric D** 3 ½" square and (1) **Fabric A** 3 ½" x 6 ½" rectangle. Join units as shown below.










Create (8) Block #1 Centers

- 7. Repeat to create (8) Block #1 centers. Block #1 centers should measure 12 ½" square unfinished.
- **8.** Sew (4) **Fabric C** 9 ½" HST to opposite sides of the Block #1 center, matching middle of HST with middle of the quilt center edge. Repeat on remaining (2) sides. Press seams outward toward **Fabric C** to complete Block #1.




9. Repeat to create (8) Block #1. Trim block points to measure 17 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square unfinished, trimming $\frac{1}{2}$ " past.


Block #2

10. Place (1) **Fabric A** 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " marked square, RST, on the corner of (1) **Fabric H** 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ ", (1) **Fabric H** 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ ", (1) **Fabric I** 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ " and (1) **Fabric I** 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles.

Please Note: **Fabric A** squares with the drawn diagonal lines will be oriented differently for each fabric rectangle. Refer to diagrams below.



- 11. Sew along the drawn diagonal line for each of the Fabric H and Fabric I rectangles as shown.
- **12.** Trim the seam allowance fabric to ¼", and press seams outward to complete the rectangle units for Block #2.






13. Repeat to create (8) completed rectangle units of each fabric and size as described in Steps 10-12. Diagrams show accurate fabric orientation and unfinished sizes for each rectangle.













14. Begin Block #2 center assembly using all rectangle units created in Steps 10-13, (1) **Fabric A** 3 ½" square, (1) **Fabric G** 3 ½" square and (1) **Fabric A** 3 ½" x 6 ½" rectangle. Join units as shown below.










Create (8) Block #2 Centers

- **15.** Repeat to create (8) Block #2 centers. Block #2 centers should measure 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square unfinished.
- **16.** Sew (4) **Fabric B** 9 ½" HST to opposite sides of the Block #2 center, matching middle of HST with middle of quilt center edge. Repeat on remaining (2) sides. Press seams outward toward **Fabric B** to complete Block #2.

17. Repeat to create (8) Block #2. Trim Block B to measure 17 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square unfinished, trimming $\frac{1}{4}$ " past block points.

Quilt Assembly

- **18.** The quilt is assembled in a 4×4 grid. Lay out the blocks according to the quilt layout diagram. Begin sewing blocks together in horizontal rows (alternate between Blocks #1 and #2), alternating the direction in which you press the seams in each row.
- 19. Sew the horizontal block rows together to complete the quilt top center.
















- **20.** Begin Border 1 assembly by sewing (8) **Fabric J** 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips together end to end using a diagonal seam. Trim (2) strips to 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 68 $\frac{1}{2}$ " for the side borders. Sew the strips to the left and right sides of the quilt center. Trim (2) strips to 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 70 $\frac{1}{2}$ " for the top/bottom borders. Sew the remaining strips to the top / bottom of quilt center.
- **21.** Begin Border 2 assembly by sewing (8) **Fabric B** 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips together end to end using a diagonal seam. Trim (2) strips to 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 70 $\frac{1}{2}$ " for the side borders. Sew the strips to the left and right sides of the quilt center. Trim (2) strips to 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 74 $\frac{1}{2}$ " for the top/bottom borders.
- **22.** Begin Border 3 assembly by sewing (9) **Fabric G** 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips together end to end *using a diagonal seam.* Trim (2) strips to 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 74 $\frac{1}{2}$ " for the side borders. Sew the strips to the left and right sides of the quilt center. Trim (2) strips to 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 80 $\frac{1}{2}$ " for the top/bottom borders. Sew the remaining strips to the top / bottom of quilt center.

Finishing

- 23. With the backing fabric laying taut, place batting and then quilt top to form quilt sandwich.
- 24. Baste and quilt as desired.
- 25. Attach Fabric J binding to complete quilt.
